Internet Safety Policy

Internet Usage Statement:

Scoil San Carlo J.N.S believes in the benefits of Curriculum Internet use.

The purpose of the **AUP** (Acceptable Usage Policy) is to ensure that pupils will benefit from learning opportunities offered by the school's internet resources, and will be protected from harmful and illegal use of the Internet.

School's Strategy:

The school will employ a number of strategies to maximise learning opportunities at an appropriate level for the 4-8 year olds in our care and reduce risks associated with the Internet. It is envisaged, at this time, that much internet use with younger children will be of a demonstrative nature, supporting classroom work.

Strategies Scoil San Carlo will employ to reduce risks are as follows:

1. Acceptable Usage Policy (AUP)
2. Education
3. Filtering/Monitoring

Sanctions:

If a pupil deliberately misuses the Internet, this will result in disciplinary action including the withdrawal of access privileges as mentioned in the Code Of Behaviour of Scoil San Carlo J.N.S. Parents/guardians will receive written notification of misuse by a pupil.

Scoil San Carlo J.N.S also reserves the right to report any illegal activities to the appropriate authorities.



1. AUP

Acceptable Usage Policy for Scoil San Carlo J.N.S

Internet:

1. Internet will be used for Educational Purposes only.
2. Internet sessions will always be supervised by a teacher.
3. Internet sessions with our younger pupils will always be supervised and directed by a teacher
4. Pupils will seek permission before entering any Internet site, unless previously approved by a teacher.
5. Filtering software will be used to minimise the risk of exposure to inappropriate material.
6. The school will regularly monitor pupils' internet usage.
7. Pupils will receive training in the area of Internet Safety in conjunction with SPHE programmes and through arranged Internet Safety seminars.
8. Posters highlighting Internet safety will be displayed in the ICT room.
9. Teachers & parents will be made aware of Internet Safety issues through arranged Internet Safety seminars.
10. Uploading and downloading of non-approved material is banned
11. Virus protection software will be used and updated on a regular basis.
12. The use of personal external storage devices or CD-ROMS in school requires a teacher's permission in accordance with the school's ICT policy
13. Pupils will observe good "netiquette" (etiquette on the Internet) at all times and will not undertake any action that may bring a school into disrepute.

Internet Chat:

Students are **not permitted** to use Internet Chat Rooms.

Email:

1. Pupils under the direction of the class teacher will use their approved set up class email account.
2. Approved set up class email accounts are solely for teaching and learning purposes and not for parent/staff communication
3. Pupils (or parents) will not send or receive any material that is illegal, obscene, defamatory or that is intended to annoy or intimidate another person.
4. Pupils will note that sending and receiving email attachments is subject to permission from their teacher.

School Website:

Designated teachers & school's ICT consultant will manage the publication of material on the school website.

1. Personal pupil information, home addresses and contact details will not be published on the school website.
2. Class lists will not be published.
3. Pupils' names will not be published beside their photograph.
4. Digital photographs, video clips and audio clips of individual pupils will not be published on the school website. Instead photographs, audio and video clips will focus on groups and group activities.
5. Pupils will be given an opportunity to publish projects, artwork or other curricular work on the school website.
6. Class teachers will select work to be published and decide on the appropriateness of such.
7. Permission to publish a student's work will be sought from pupils/parents/guardians at enrolment. This permission may be withdrawn at any time.
8. Pupils will continue to own the copyright on any work published.



2. Education

Scoil San Carlo J.N.S will undertake an education programme to educate children on the safe, responsible use of the Internet.

21st Century life presents dangers including violence, racism and exploitation from which children and young people need to be protected. At the same time they need to learn to recognise and avoid these risks – to become Internet Wise.



3. Filtering

Filtering is a term used to describe a way of limiting the content of web pages, chat rooms and other electronic fora to which users may be exposed. No filter is 100% accurate. The most effective filtering tool is Teacher Vigilance.

Many browsers have their own built in filtering tool e.g. Google. Google's search engine has a built-in "Safe Search". This filter eliminates sites that contain pornography and explicit sexual content from search results. It is easily applied by clicking on the **Preferences** link on any Google page. Unfortunately it is also easily removed.

Firewalls

Windows XP & Windows 10 has a built-in firewall. Firewall Software can be purchased or downloaded free from the Internet. AVG anti-virus software is downloaded onto the tablet devices in Scoil San Carlo JNS.



Responsible Internet Use

Pupil Undertaking:

We use the School tablet, computers and Internet connection for learning. These rules will help us to be fair to others and keep everyone safe.

- I will ask permission before entering any Web site, unless my teacher has already approved that site.
- I will not bring external storage devices such as usb keys and CD-ROMs into school without permission.
- I will not use Internet chat.
- If I see anything I am unhappy with, I will tell a teacher immediately.
- I know that the school may check my computer and tablet files and may monitor the sites I visit.
- I understand that if I deliberately break these rules, I could be stopped from using the Internet, the tablets and computers and my parents will be informed.

Please read carefully the terms of the Acceptable Usage Policy and the school's website publishing policy in relation to publishing pupils' work and photographs of school activities on the website. At enrolment, you were asked to consider your consent of your child's schoolwork and photograph for inclusion on Scoil San Carlo JNS' school website. (question 7 & 8)
